Third consecutive fourth overall for Chisholm

Team Royal Distributing Motovan Piller's Racing presented by Huber Motorsports' Kyle Chisholm recorded his third consecutive fourth overall on Sunday at Round 9 of the CMRC sanctioned Rockstar Energy Drink Motocross Nationals, which were held in Deschambault, Quebec.

Chisholm, who cleared the task with 5-4 motos, moved up one notch in the points chase from seventh place to sixth, trailing his teammate Tyler Medaglia by 36 points as the series heads into the final round this weekend. Unfortunately, a technical gremlin betrayed Medaglia in the second moto, leaving him with a DNF and a 14th overall, thanks to claiming fourth in moto 1.



Despite a high of only 17°C (63°F) and cloudy skies ruling the day, a massive crowd came to the Motocross Deschambault circuit to attend Round 9 of the title hunt. The event had been in jeopardy, however, due to heavy rains drenching the soft, loamy, sand-based soil track in the morning.

Fortunately, the rains ceased around mid-morning and thanks to the diligent work by the Deschambault track crew, the first MX2 moto went ahead only slightly behind schedule. At the riders' meeting it was decided to shorten the motos for both classes by five minutes.



Although the first MX2 moto was run on a very muddy track, conditions kept improving, especially during the first MX1 moto. By the time the second motos were staged after the intermission, the track, consisting of a steep drop-off, plenty of elevation changes and massive jumps, had been transformed into ideal racing condition.

The start of the first moto saw both Medaglia and Chisholm nail down top-10 starts on their potent Honda CRF450Rs, arriving at turn 1 in sixth and eighth respectively. Both riders quickly charged ahead, with

Medaglia in fifth and Chisholm in sixth within a few laps. On lap 5 Medaglia took control of fourth place while Chisholm snagged fifth place on lap seven. They would hold those positions until the checkered flag, finishing behind winner Colton Facciotti, second place Christophe Pourcel and third place Matt Goerke.

In moto 2, Medaglia and Chisholm got off to top-five starts, pouring on the gas to snare third and fifth respectively. On lap 6 Medaglia got passed by Pourcel, who had started in fourth. Two laps later Medaglia faced a worst-case scenario, having to park his bike and become a spectator. Chisholm, meanwhile, who had held fast in fifth place, inherited fourth from his ill-fated teammate. He took it all the way to the checkered flag, finishing behind Facciotti, Pourcel and Goerke, who again mounted the podium in that order.



Although Medaglia scored zero points in the second moto, he can take some consolation that he is poised to finish the season with a No.5 ranking. Mathematically only Chisholm can unseat him. Third Royal Distributing Motovan Piller’s Racing presented by Huber Motorsports team member Nathan Bles, who missed Round 9 and will be unable to race at Round 10 due to a concussion suffered during a crash at Round 8, looks fairly secure points-wise to still end the season with a No.12 ranking.

The final round of the Rockstar Energy Drink Motocross Nationals take place on Sunday, August 13th at RJ Motosport Park in Barrie, Ontario.
